

current use because it is no longer in its natural state. The owner uses the material for his own use on his property. Mr. Thomson referenced page 45 of the Current Use Booklet which describes the qualifying uses for forestry and agricultural purposes. Mr. Hamilton suggested the owner have a conversation with the town to understand their concerns and to answer any questions they may have about the property. He added there is an appeal process at the BTLA if necessary and their website can be searched for similar cases.

Mr. Hamilton stated a letter was received from Jasen Stock from the NH Timber Owners Association that will be included in the record. In his concluding statement, he states, *“After reviewing the proposed rate changes in the context of state and regional timber markets we believe the changes are appropriate.”*

No other public input received.

Mr. Hamilton closed the public forum at 10:20 a.m.
